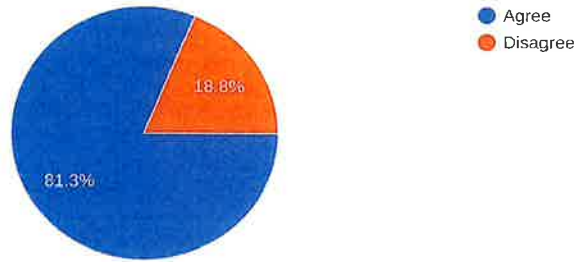
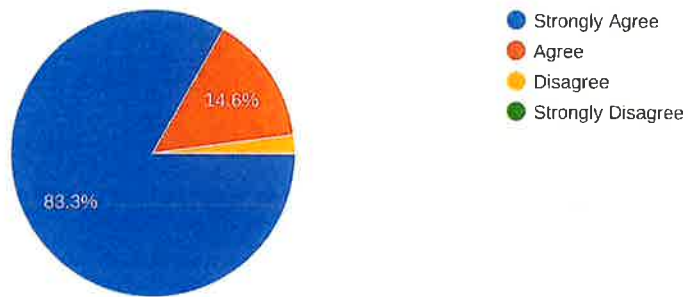

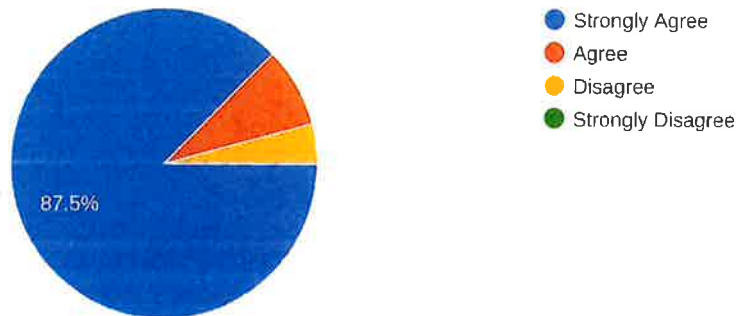
I know what the School-Parent Compact is.

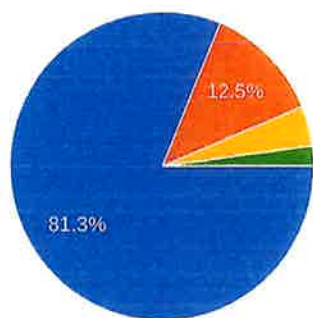


I am familiar with academic standards my child is expected to meet this year.

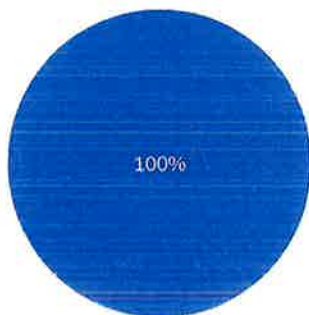

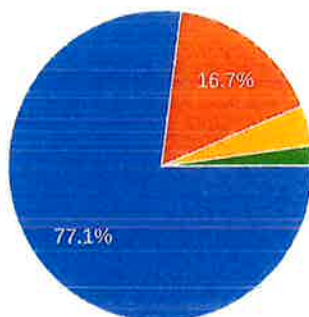

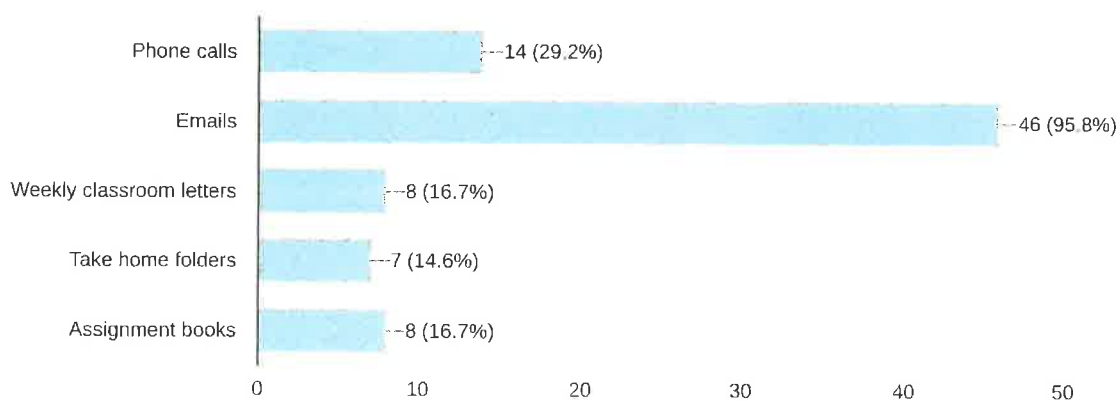

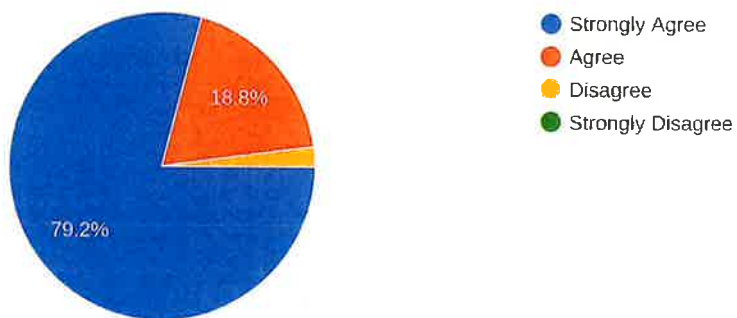
I prefer teachers to communicate with me through:

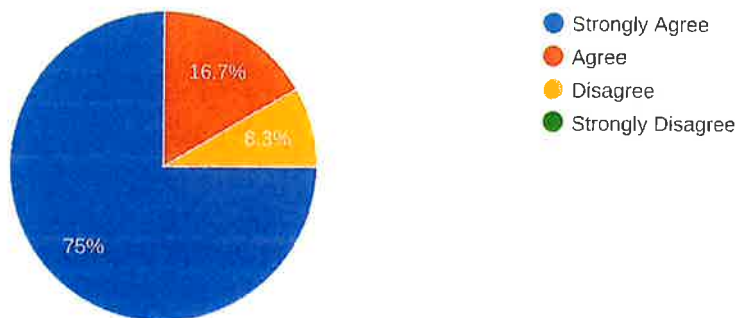
My child receives additional academic help when needed.

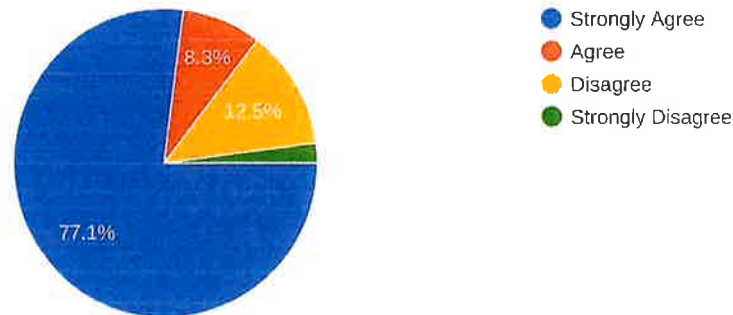
I feel that the school hears and respects my child's voice. (DB3B)

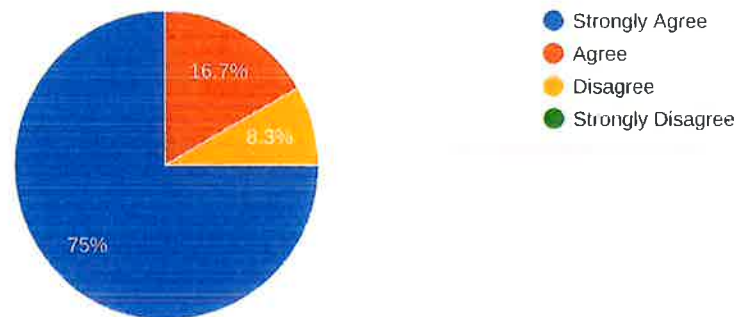
My child's teacher asks me how my child learns best.

I feel like there is a good variety of interactions currently and feel they should keep these up. Regarding the issue we have had, if a child is exhibiting problem behaviors or learning, I would rather not have to wait until a school-wide conference to find out in a rushed manner. I feel if intervention is needed, this should be scheduled to review soonest possible, individually, as some details get lost in translation when rushing to get on to the next family and teachers wanting to get home.

I can do various remote meeting formats if given sufficient notice, if in person is not feasible.

We really like the back to school fair so we can meet new teachers.

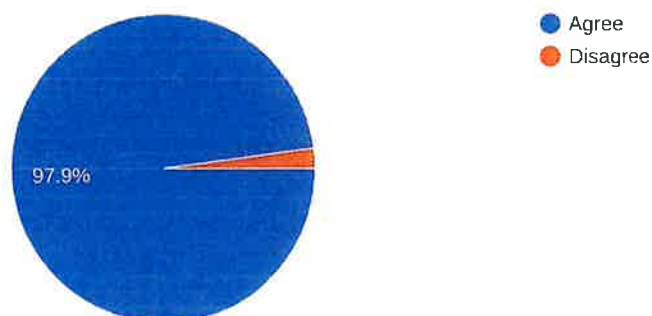
The formats seem to consider working parents. When I worked evenings I was able to attend during the day. I have even had teachers arrange phone conferences.

I usually check the school Facebook page. It seems to have the most information. I am on the portal to check grades and get texts as well.

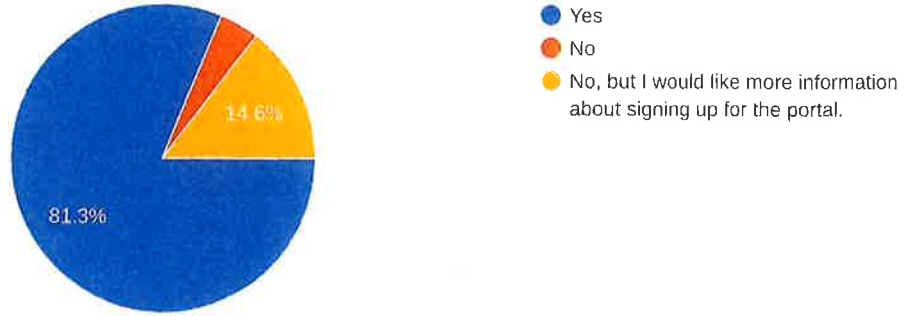
I like the Facebook page

I prefer using Facebook. I know there's other ways the school communicates but Facebook is the one that I prefer.

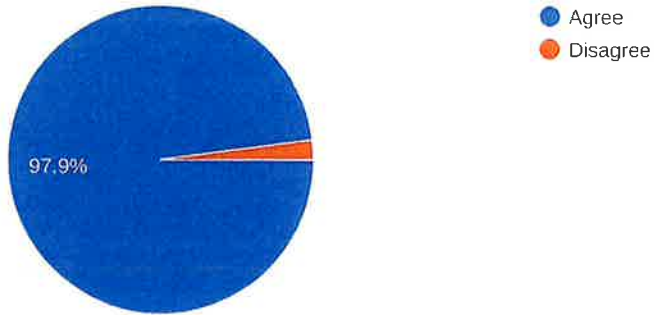
I am signed up for the parent portal where I am able to see my child's grades.

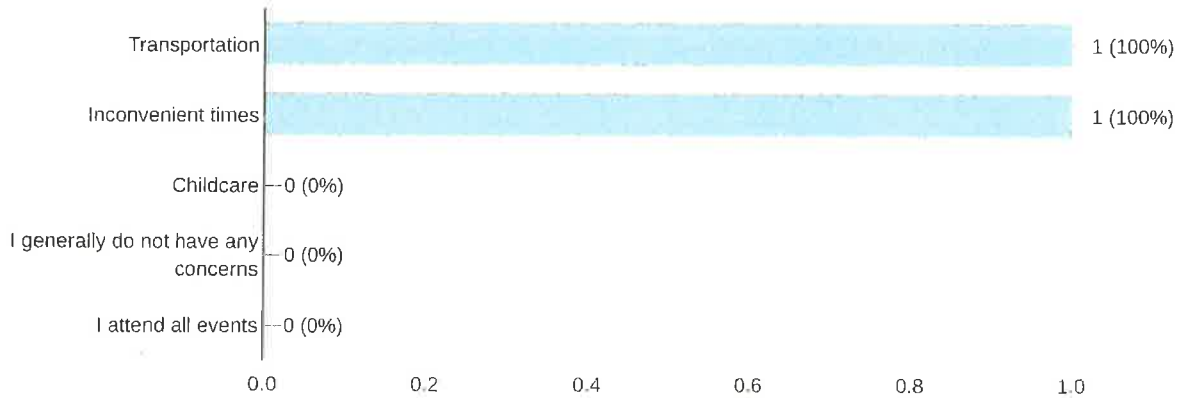
The school schedules parent-teacher conferences when I can attend.
